Woerth gave the parks report. Woerth commented on land for sale that abuts Capital Square Park. Wheeldon gave the street report. Fish gave the water/wastewater report and Sailors gave the clerks report.

In Old Business, a motion was made by Woerth to approve the ordinance to close the west half of 7th St. lying between Allen and the Hwy 136 right of way and abutted on the west side by Block 5 1/2, Lots 7 & 8, Brown's add to the Village of Brownville with the Village retaining rights to the property for the purpose of repairing utilities. Motion was seconded by Lokke. Wheeldon yes, Woerth yes, Fish yes, Johnson yes and Lokke yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Woerth, second by Lokke to approve the Internal Control Policy with the recommended changes. Woerth yes, Fish yes, Johnson yes, Lokke yes, and Wheeldon yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Wheeldon, second by Fish to pass the ordinance to raise the residential water rates to \$25.00 per month for the first 1000 gallons and \$5.00 for each additional 1000 gallons. Fish yes, Johnson yes, Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes, Woerth yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Wheeldon, second by Fish to amend the Town Hall Use Policy to include waiving the fee for the Town Hall when it is being used for funeral luncheons. Johnson no, Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes, Fish yes, Woerth yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Fish, second by Wheeldon to table the Trailer Ordinance review. Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes, Woerth yes, Fish yes, Johnson yes. Motion carried.

Action for the Trailhead Gazebo was postponed until the July meeting.

In New Business, a motion by Wheeldon, second by Fish to approve the liquor license for the Brownville Market. Woerth yes, Fish yes, Johnson yes, Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes. Motion carried.

A public hearing was held on the CDBG – Public Works- Culvert Improvement Project 21PW004. The comments from the public were "looks great" and "yeah" when I was announced that is came in under budget. Motion by Lokke, second by Woerth to close the public hearing. Fish yes, Johnson yes, Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes, Woerth yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Fish, second by Wheeldon to amend the proposal for the alarm system for the water tower. The system will be a cell phone operated system at a cost of \$2241 to the Village. Johnson yes, Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes, Fish yes, Woerth yes. Motion carried.

After a lengthy discussion of the water and sewer billing for non-profits and other village organizations, there was a motion by Fish, second by Wheeldon that all customers pay a monthly bill. Lokke yes, Wheeldon yes, Woerth no, Fish yes, Johnson yes. Motion carried. Radio read meters will be installed at the addresses not currently equipped with them.

Motion by Wheeldon, second by Lokke to adjourn at 7:56 p.m. Wheeldon yes, Woerth yes, Fish yes, Johnson yes, Lokke yes. Motion carried.
